Greetings from our Chairman

Dear All

Welcome to the final ever Commissioners quarterly newsletter.

In an effort to cut costs and make more efficient use of ratepayers' money, it was decided in May of this year to phase this quarterly newsletter out and replace it with an Annual publication to be circulated each June, coinciding with the Marown Parish Day. This small change will result in a saving of over $\pounds 2,500$ per year. Going forward I urge you to pay regular visits to our new website (www.marown.im) which will be kept up-to-date with all the latest local news and information on services within the community.

Remembrance Sunday not only gives us time to remember past and present conflicts but it also allows us to reflect on our own lives and on what it means to be free as a result of the enormous sacrifices made by all members of the armed forces. Earlier this month, following the annual Remembrance Service, I had the honour of laying a wreath at the Marown War Memorial on behalf of the people of the parish. Later the same day I was also privileged to attend the Isle of Man National Service of Remembrance.

We are <u>still</u> receiving complaints from the public in relation to some dog owners not binning their dogs mess, and instead, throwing it into hedges. I know I have mentioned this in the past but it is worth repeating. To put it bluntly, this has got to stop! They are doing the unpleasant part by bagging the mess but not bothering to put the bags into the bins provided. To this effect we are taking action. In order to help dog owners we will be installing two additional specific dog bins at the junction of Alexander Road/ St Runius Way and on Queen Margaret Way in Glen Vine.

In addition to the above, after a period of consultation, we have submitted a Marown Dog Control Bye-law to be approved by Tynwald. This bye-law will impose controls on dogs in certain parts of the parish of Marown. Dogs will be prohibited from specified open spaces and must not be at large in specifically defined areas. Dog owners will also be responsible for ensuring the removal of dog faeces. Contravention of these bye-laws will be an offence by the keeper of the dog, punishable by a fixed penalty of £50 or, upon summary conviction, a fine of up to £1,000. You have been warned!!

Not wishing to end on a foul note[©], there are numerous Christmas community events taking place during the coming weeks and, as Marown is built on its community spirit, I encourage you to attend as many as you can and show your support.

Finally, I would like to wish you all a very happy Christmas and a healthy and prosperous 2017.
